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this clear and comprehensive text covers the middle ages from the classical era to the late medieval period distinguished historian john m riddle provides a cogent analysis of the rulers wars and events both natural and human that defined the medieval era taking a broad geographical perspective riddle includes northern and eastern europe byzantium and the islamic states each he convincingly shows offered values and institutions religious devotion

toleration and intolerance laws ways of thinking and changing roles of women that presaged modernity in addition to traditional topics of pen sword and word the author explores other driving forces such as science religion and technology in ways that previous textbooks have not he also examines such often overlooked issues as medieval gender roles and medicine and seminal events such as the crusades from the vantage point of both muslims and eastern and western christians in addition to a thorough chronological narrative the text offers humanizing features to engage students each chapter opens with a theme setting vignette about the lives of ordinary and extraordinary people the book also introduces students to key controversies and themes in historiography by featuring in each chapter a prominent medieval historian and how his or her ideas have shaped contemporary thinking about the middle ages richly illustrated this lively engaging book will immerse readers in the medieval world an era that shaped the foundation for the modern world

although life in the middle ages was not as comfortable and safe as it is for most people in industrialized countries today the term dark ages is highly misleading the era was not so primitive and crude as depictions in film and literature would suggest even during the worst years of the centuries immediately following the fall of rome the legacy of that civilization survived this book covers diet cooking housing building clothing hygiene games and other pastimes fighting and healing in medieval times the reader will find numerous misperceptions corrected the book also includes a comprehensive bibliography and a listing of collections of medieval art and artifacts and related sites across the united states and canada so that readers in north america can see for themselves some of the matters discussed in the book instructors considering this book for use in a course may request an examination copy here

the extraordinary array of images included in this volume reveals the full and rich history of the middle ages exploring material objects from the european byzantine and islamic worlds the book casts a new light on the cultures that formed them each culture illuminated by its treasures the objects are divided among four topics the holy and the faithful the sinful and the spectral daily life and its fictions and death and its aftermath each section is organized chronologically and every object is accompanied by a penetrating essay that focuses on its visual and cultural significance within the wider context in which the object was made and used spot maps add yet another way to visualize and consider the significance of the objects and the history that they reveal lavishly illustrated this is an appealing and original guide to the cultural history of the middle ages

beginning with the merger of roman christian and germanic cultures this history of the middle ages covers a vast array of subjects including byzantium and the islamic world feudalism church reform architecture the crusades courtly love the magna carta and the hundred years war author barbara a hanawalt uses a lively and anecdotal writing style to bring history alive for young readers she delves into the telling details that young adults find fascinating such as the different kinds of armor and weapons used by knights on horseback and the terrifying spread of the black death through europe in the 14th century lavishly illustrated with art photographs documents artifacts and maps the middle ages also includes an index and suggestions for further reading

during the merovingian centuries when most kings were weak and brutal men fought over power and booty ordinary folk as well as many who were not so ordinary again found themselves in desperate need of protection the result was the appearance and wide extension of a practice called commendation from back cover

a brilliant historian of the ancient world michael grant turns his attention to the decisive centuries of turmoil and rebirth that followed the final collapse of the roman empire in the west the years from 476 to 816 constitute a relatively neglected period sometimes dismissed by historians as a dark age but this impressively illustrated volume puts the dawn of the middle ages in a new perspective far from a time of barbarian darkness this emerges as a remarkably rich period in both east and west a crucial time of innovation and development that went very far toward shaping our modern world it was an age of great leaders so many dominant personalities of the period have cast long shadows across the centuries and into our own time from the pages of michael grant's readable moving text there emerge fresh portraits of such giants as justinian the great in the heyday of byzantium mohammed the prophet of arabia st benedict of italy st patrick of ireland and in the heart of western europe the larger than life figure of charlemagne it was too an age of great religions here we witness the birth of islam both as a church and as a political force and the fateful split almost from the beginning between the arabic and the iranian branches these centuries witnessed the rise of such great christian institutions as the papacy and the monastic orders which were to change the catholic church forever judaism too underwent crucial changes in the further refinement of talmudic studies and the establishment of the longlasting patterns of ghetto community life above all this was an age of great art from spain to china from sweden and the british isles to north africa this book captures the glories of that past age in a remarkable series of fine color illustrations highlights include the gleaming tile surfaces of the moslem palaces and
